#### Instruction for the authors

The speakers should represent their results in a compact form with the duration of the lecture up to 20 minutes (include discussion). The short comment speakers should present their contributions for up to 10 minutes. Those who wish to contribute with a poster should prepare it with the size  $90 \times 120$  cm. A **short abstract** (2–5 sentences) **should be sent by December 15<sup>th</sup>, 2025.** Confirmation of paper acceptance — till January 10<sup>th</sup>, 2025. **The full-text paper contribution should be sent until February 14<sup>th</sup>, 2025**, in 4 to 6 pages A5 format. The peer-reviewed ISBN conference proceedings will include all contributions and posters presented at the conference.

#### Registration

The fee, registration information, and forms will be available on the conference web page **wpppa.educell.sk**. Early registration is  $350 \in (200 \in \text{students})$  until January  $31^{\text{st}}$ , 2025 and registration after that is  $450 \in (300 \in \text{students})$ . Registration fees include lunches, Anniversary Meetings, a visit to the Opening, and a hardcopy of the conference proceedings.
